The tree in our sanctuary is a CHRISMON TREE

Christmas are Christmas decorations with Christian symbols on them. They help Christians to remember that Christmas is the celebration of Jesus's birthday. They are often used on Christmas Trees in Churches and Christians homes. Chrismons are traditionally colored white and gold. White is the liturgical (or Church) color for Christmas and symbolizes that Jesus was pure and perfect. Gold symbolizes His Majesty and Glory. Chrismons can be made from nearly anything, but paper and embroidered ones are the most widely used.



We have found that without lots of TLC, poinsettia plants do not thrive in our sanctuary. So, instead of memorializing those special people in our lives with poinsettia plants, we have an opportunity to make a donation in lieu of a plant. This year you are invited to memorialize those special people in your life with a donation to the Parish House Floor Fund.
